
Lunch Bunch

Deviled Crab Cakes

with Chive Cream



3 Tbsp. snipped chives

1 Tbsp. fresh lemon juice

1 tsp. honey

1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

1/2 tsp. dry mustard

12 oz. crab meat (fresh or canned and drained) Salt and cayenne pepper

3/4 cup Panko or other fine bread crumbs

In a large bowl, combine first six ingredients. Fold in crab meat, salt, and cayenne pepper. Stir in 4 tablespoons of bread crumbs until mixture just holds together. Place remaining bread crumbs in a shallow bowl.

Roll crab mixture into large walnut-size balls. Drop balls into bread crumbs in bowl; gently roll balls until coated. Place on a baking sheet; gently press to flatten slightly. Cover with plastic and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes or up to 24 hours.

Preheat oven to 400°. Remove plastic; bake for 20 minutes, until crisp, golden, and warmed through.

Top cakes with a tiny dollop of sour cream, a sprinkle of paprika and minced chives.
